2015 HONORARY MEMBERS

CAGS Honorary Members

Dr. William J Wall, C.M., M.D., F.R.C.S.(C)

Dr. Wall graduated from Western's medical school in 1970 where he afterward completed his residency and then was appointed to the Faculty of Surgery at Western in 1977. He established Canada's first successful liver transplant program at University Hospital, where nearly 2,000 transplants were performed during his career. His patients are the longest surviving recipients in Canada and amongst the longest in the world. He performed Canada's first liver transplants using live donors, was the first to split a liver for two separate recipients, and was the first to transplant livers from donation after cardiac death donors. He served as Director of the Multi-Organ Transplant Program at University Hospital from 1997-2007. He has served on numerous professional and government committees and has published more than 150 scientific papers.



Dr. Wall and colleagues at University Hospital established the education curriculum "One Life...Many Gifts" to educate secondary school students about organ donation and transplantation. As a founding member of the International Liver Transplant Society, Dr. Wall served as its President from 1995-1997. In 1998 he received the Gold Medal from The Canadian Liver Foundation. The Canadian Society of Transplantation honoured him with its Lifetime Achievement Award in 2009, and that same year he was appointed to the Order of Canada. In 2013, Dr. Wall was the recipient of the National Medical Achievement Award of the David Foster Foundation.

Dr. Hugh Scarth, M.Sc, M.D., F. R.C.S.(C)

Dr. Hugh Scarth was born in Nova Scotia in 1950 and went to Dalhousie University and graduated with a B.Sc. in 1972. After working for two years in a clinical chemistry lab in Saint John, NB and completing an M.Sc. in Microbiology in 1978, he entered medical school at the University of Toronto and in 1987 he completed the General Surgery Program at the University of Toronto. During his 27 years in Saint John he was involved in several projects, locally, nationally and internationally, such as; Chair of the steering committee that led to the designation of the Saint John Regional Hospital as a tertiary trauma centre, the first designated site east of Montreal; he was a member of the steering committee for the development of the Breast Cancer Guidelines published in CMAJ, and had been a member of two committees of CPAC looking at synoptic reporting of surgical procedures and breast cancer management wait times. Saint John was the 6th highest accrual site of 80 centres in the US and Canada. He was, over the years, clinical department head of General Surgery and the chair of the Surgical Group at the Saint John Regional Hospital. Maria Boudreau has been Dr. Scarth's executive partner who has managed his practice for many years and his personal life for the last 5 years. He has two children; Elizabeth, and Alex and his plans for retirement are to sail, travel and assist in the OR.



CSCRS Honorary Member

Dr. Paul Belliveau, C.M., M.D., M.P.A., F.R.C.S.(C)

The CSCRS would like to recognize and congratulate Dr. Belliveau on his outstanding achievements in the advancement of Colorectal Surgery in Canada. His achievements are too numerous to list, but some include: being a founding member of the Canadian Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons in 1983; he was vice-President of the society in 1989 to 1992 and President in 1992 to 1995; he held the title of Chair of the Royal College Specialty Committee for Colon and Rectal Surgery from 2008 to 2012; he had been an active participant in the Examination Board for the Royal College examinations in Colorectal Surgery from 2009 to 2014 and was recognized with a Founder Designation in Colon and Rectal Surgery from the Royal College in 2011. Since Dr. Belliveau began his fellowship training in colon and rectal surgery at St Mark's Hospital under Sir Alan Parks in 1979-80 and at the University of Minnesota in 1980-81, he has worked tirelessly and productively to promote the subspecialty of colon and rectal surgery. He is known for his research on the ileoanal pouch, endoluminal brachytherapy for rectal cancer, and surgical education. He has been awarded for excellence in teaching on multiple occasions. The CSCRS salutes and recognizes the important contributions that Dr. Belliveau has achieved in his career as an academic surgeon in the specialty of colon and rectal surgery.
